Pakistan Monthly Climate Summary
June 2026

In brief

- The country-level night-time (minimum) temperature of 25.2°C was **warmer than average** by +0.6°C than the countrywide average of 24.6 °C.
- The national mean temperature of 32.0°C (+0.3°C) tied up with the June monthly average.
- Correspondingly, the daytime (maximum) temperature of 38.8 °C at country-level was **about average** with a nil anomaly.
- The national area-weighted rainfall of 19.6 mm was **below average** with a negative departure of **-19%** in June-2026.
- The **hottest** day of the month was observed at Sh. Benazirabad on 1st & Dadu (Sindh) on 11th & 12th when they recorded a maximum temperature of **51.0 °C**. Whereas, the station Sibbi proved to be the **warmest** place with a mean monthly maximum temperature of **46.7 °C**.
- The **coldest** night temperature of **8.0 °C** of the month was recorded at Astore (Gilgit-Baltistan) on 6th and at Malam Jabba (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa) on 6th, 20th & 21st June. However, the station Babusar (GB) happened to be the **coldest** place with mean monthly minimum temperature of **10.9 °C**.
- The heaviest one-day rainfall of **71.6 mm** occurred at Joharabad (Punjab) on 13th June, Whereas the Malam Jabba (KP) has been the wettest place with monthly total of **261.0 mm**.
- Niño indices indicate that it has turned into El Niño with sea surface temperatures (SST) anomaly around **+1.02 °C** over the central equatorial Pacific Ocean.
- The Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) is in neutral phase.

Synoptic Summary

In June 2026, four westerly troughs entered through northern parts of the country during 1–7, 12–14, 17–23, and 25–30, affected Gilgit-Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, Punjab, Northeast Balochistan and Sindh. The seasonal low remained oriented over north/northwest Balochistan throughout the month, with its central pressure generally ranged between 992 and 996 hpa. In addition, weak moist currents from the Arabian Sea penetrated into the central and

upper parts of the country during 12–14 June, enhancing moisture availability over the region. The combined influence of the successive westerly troughs and the influx of moist currents resulted in widespread rain and thundershowers over Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), Gilgit-Baltistan (GB), Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJK), Punjab, while light to moderate rainfall in North Balochistan and Sindh. Isolated hailstorms and dust-storms were also reported at a few places during these weather systems.

Meanwhile heat wave conditions prevailed over the plain areas of the country due to persistently high temperatures and dry continental air during 8-12 June.

Rainfall: Well below average

Climatologically, June is considered as an average rainy month with rainfall contribution to the national annual and seasonal (Apr-Jun, AMJ) totals being 7.6% and 37.4%, respectively. During the month, Pakistan experienced some good rainy spells and thundershower over KP, GB, AJK and Punjab, few hailstorms & dust-thunderstorms in northeastern Balochistan & in upper Sindh, but overall monthly total remained below average. The daily area-weighted rainfall is shown in Fig-1.

The June 2026 with area-weighted rain of 19.6 mm was observed **below average** with a departure of **-19%** for Pakistan as a whole. The situation was more or less similar on regional scale. i.e., Sindh with 8.5 mm **(-24%)**, KP with 34.6 mm **(-22%)**, GB with 11.2 mm **(-21%)** Balochistan with 10.7 mm **(-19%)**, Punjab with 33.4mm **(- 17%)** & AJK with 57.4 mm **(-15%)** all observed **below average** rainfall (Table-4).

The heaviest one-day rainfall of **71.6 mm** occurred at Joharabad (Punjab) on 13th June. The MalamJabba (KP) has been the wettest place with monthly total of **261.0 mm** (Table-1).

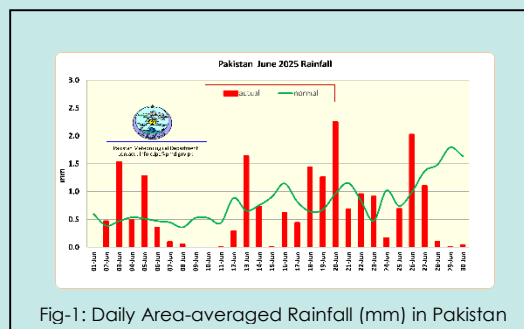


Fig-1: Daily Area-averaged Rainfall (mm) in Pakistan

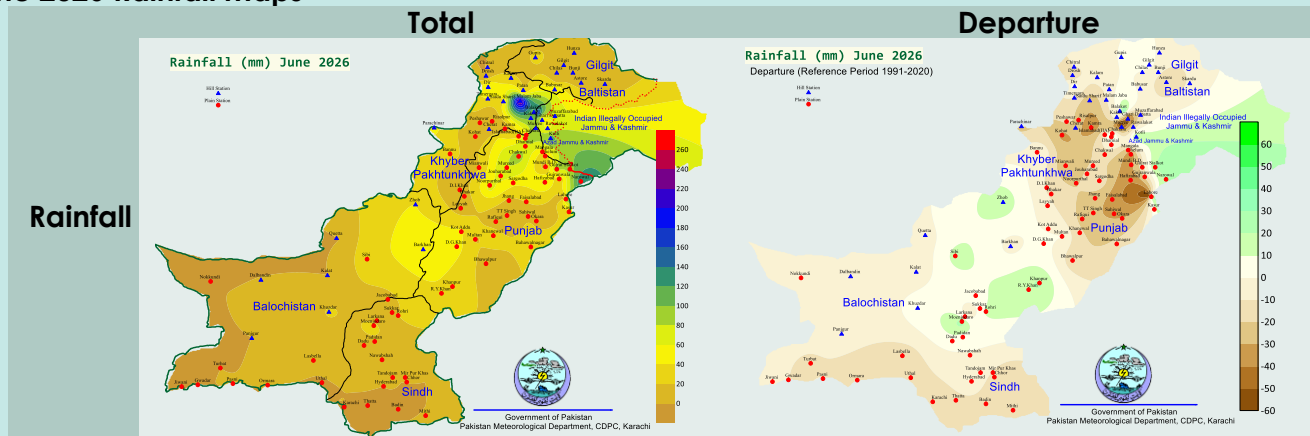


Fig. 2. June-2026 spatial rainfall distribution and departure from normal

Apart from Malam Jabba (KP) -the wettest site, the other significant rains have been: Muzaffarabad Airport 170.8 mm, Muzaffarabad City 164.5 mm, Narowal 137.9 mm, Kotli 112.0 mm, Kakul, 104.0 mm, Chaklala Airbase 99.0 mm, Lahore Airport 95.0 mm, Chakwal 92.1 mm, Murree 92.0 mm, Gujrat, 90.1 mm, Sialkot (Cantt) 88.8 mm, Sialkot Airport 82.3 mm, Joharabad 79.6 mm, Dir 68.0 mm, Hafizabad 67.4 mm, Noorpur Thal 66.7 mm, Garhi Dopatta 60.7 mm, Islamabad (Zeropoint) 56.9 mm, Rawalakot 52.9 mm, and Barkhan 52.0 mm.

On the other hand, the stations; Chhor, Hyderabad Airport, Karachi Airport, Mithi, Sukkur, Thatta, Mirpur Khas, Khairpur, Gawadar, Jiwani, Kalat, Nokkundi, Panjgur, Pasni, Quetta (Sheikh Manda), Quetta (Samungli), Turbat and Ormara remained dry, with no rainfall recorded during the month. The other stations reported Traces i.e., Kamra Airbase, Mianwali Airbase, Shorkot Airbase, Kohat Airbase, Risalpur and Faisal Base.

Area-weighted Mean Temperatures

June 2026 national mean temperature of 32.0 °C was close to the country area-weighted mean of 31.7 °C with a slight positive anomaly of +0.3 °C. On regional scale, Balochistan with 32.8 °C (+0.8 °C), GB with 23.8 °C (+0.6 °C), Sindh with 34.7 °C (+0.3 °C), AJK with 25.0 °C (+0.1 °C) & KP with 29.0 °C (+0.0 °C) all recorded slightly warm to near average mean temperature. Whereas, Punjab with 33.5 °C (-0.4 °C) was the only region to remain slightly cooler than average mean temperature. The mean temperature anomalies ranged from -1.4 °C to +3.0 °C across the country with those being considerably warmer over western Balochistan.

Area-weighted Maximum temperatures

The country-level monthly mean maximum (daytime) temperature of 38.8 °C was exactly equal to the average. Whereas, a diverse situation prevailed on regional scale; i.e., GB with 31.9 °C (+0.9 °C), Balochistan with 39.8 °C (+0.5 °C) & AJK with 32.0 °C (+0.2 °C) all recorded slightly above average maximum temperatures, Whereas Punjab with 39.9 °C (-0.7 °C), KP with 36.1 °C (-0.4 °C) and Sindh with 40.9 °C (-0.2 °C) recorded cooler than average temperatures. The mean maximum temperature anomalies remained in the range from -2.5 °C to +2.3 °C in the country with those being considerably higher over Gilgit-Baltistan.

The hottest day of the month was 51.0 °C recorded at Sh. Benazirabad on 1st and Dadu (Sindh) on 11th & 12th June. However, Sibbi proved to be the warmest place with a mean monthly maximum temperature of 46.7 °C (Table-1).

Area-weighted Minimum temperatures (Warmer than average)

The country's monthly mean minimum (night-time) temperature of 25.2 °C was warmer than average by +0.6 °C than the average 24.6 °C. A similar trend was found across the regions i.e., Sindh with 28.5 °C (+0.7 °C) ranked 7th highest (record 28.8 °C in 2020), Balochistan with 25.9 °C (+1.1 °C) ranked 9th highest (record 26.5 °C in 2002), KP with 21.8 °C (+0.4 °C), and GB with 15.7 °C (+0.4 °C) all recorded above-average minimum temperatures. Whereas, the regions Punjab with 27.1 °C (+0.0 °C), and AJK with 17.9 °C (+0.0 °C), recorded near-average minimum temperatures (Table-5, Fig-3 upper panel). The mean minimum temperature anomalies ranged from -1.7 °C to +4.5 °C in the country with those being considerably warmer over western Balochistan.

The lowest night (minimum) temperature of the month was +8.0 °C recorded at Astore (Gilgit-Baltistan) on 6th and Malam Jabba (KP) on 6th, 20th & 21st June. Whereas, the station Babusar (GB) happened to be the coldest place with mean monthly minimum temperature of 10.9 °C (Table-1).

June 2026 Temperature maps

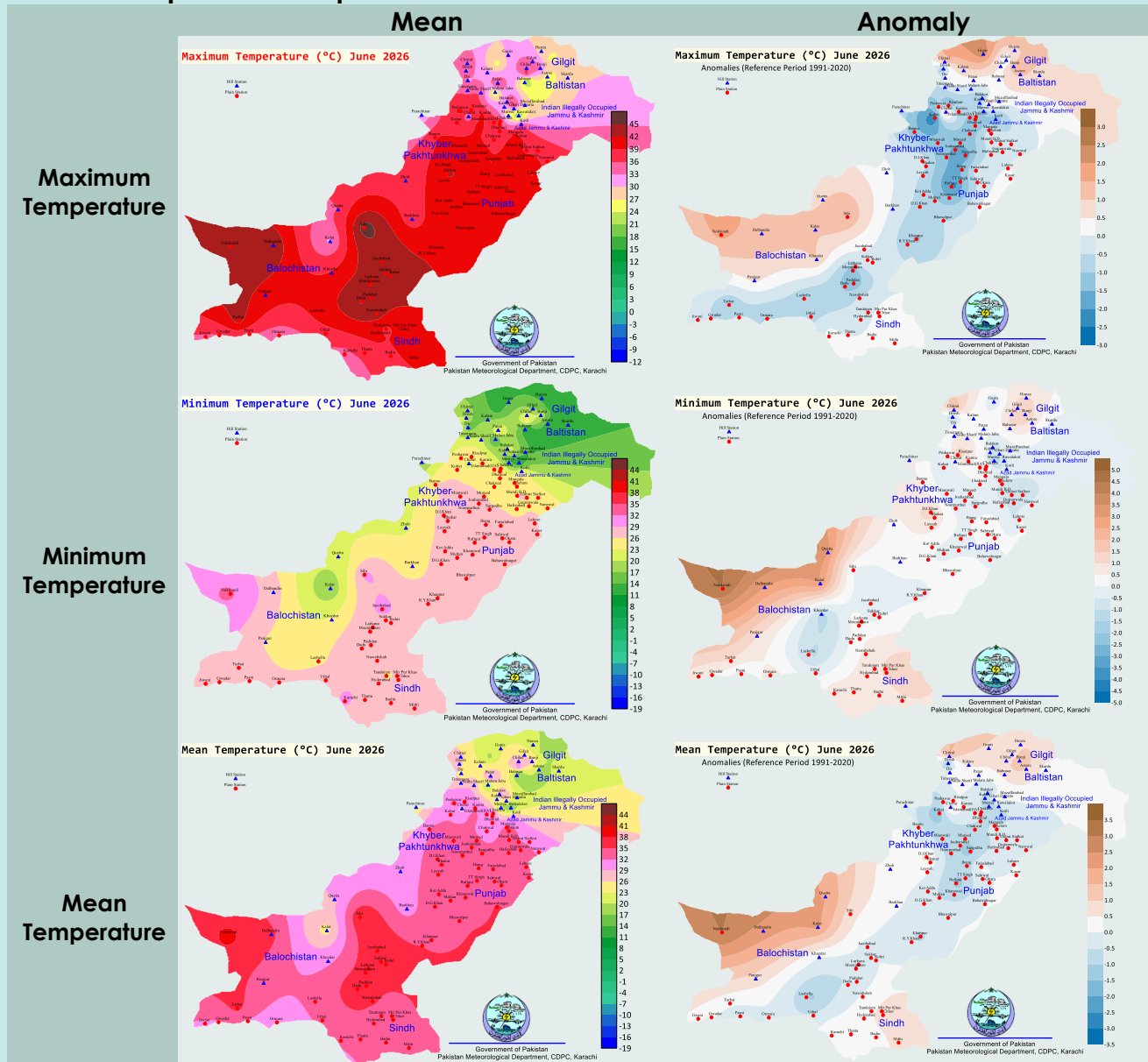


Fig. 3. June-2026 Temperatures (Maximum, Minimum & Mean) and their anomalies.

Note

Monthly Climate Summary is produced by Pakistan Meteorological Department, Climate Data Processing Centre, Karachi to provide the main features of weather events occurred in the country during the month. The summary contains detailed data information of 25 climate stations of Pakistan. The extremes & analysis is based on 110 numbers of stations. The information in the summary is based on real time data and/or electronic reports, therefore, the above results can be considered only preliminary. Climate Summaries are usually published in the first week of each month. Long term average for rainfall is for 1991-2020 (30 years) while normal period for temperature is 1991-2020 (30 years). The records mentioned for area-weighted rainfall and area average temperatures have been examined for the past 66 years i.e. from 1961-2026.
